

Free School Meals

Are you eligible to apply for Income-Related Free School Meals?

Even if your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 (where meals are provided under the Infant School Meal programme), or if your child has a packed lunch, we ask that you still claim to ensure school receives the additional funding.

Did you know that School receives a significant amount of additional funding (Pupil Premium) per child registered as being in receipt of Free School Meals?

We use this funding to support the child's education. Pupil Premium, which is in addition to main school funding, is funding from the Government to improve the attainment of disadvantaged pupils.



Children eligible for Free School Meals also receive subsidies for after school clubs and residential.

How to Apply for Free School Meals?

It is now easier for parents to apply for free school meals. The new application process means that all applications are made electronically. In just a few simple steps and a matter of minutes you will receive an instant decision on whether your application has been successful. The new application process is now live and can be accessed immediately here:
